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Goals

1. To promote and encourage a lifelong interest and participation in music.
2. To increase individual skills and knowledge as a basis for developing individual musical growth.
3. To instill value of effort, teamwork, cooperation, fellowship, self-discipline and dedication.
4. To strive for excellence.

Grading

Student assessment is based on the following: Participation; Concert Performance; Written Assignments; Playing Tests and Practice Organizers.

Participation: This grade is earned daily and is based on positive, productive participation which includes the student's punctuality, effort during class and their ability to be prepared by having all of their materials (planner, pencil, instrument, music).

Concert Performance: All students are required to attend all performances. Each student's presence at performances is essential to the success of the ensemble. If the student is on time, in proper uniform, and contributes properly to the performance, he/she will receive full credit for that performance. Problems with transportation, conflicts with family plans, etc., should be resolved by the individual to avoid conflicts with band activities. Concerts are special events and they are treated like a final exam as they are the result of many hours of rehearsals and practice. **Please refer to the Slauson concert calendar. In the event of an emergency or unavoidable conflict, please notify the director as soon as possible.**

Written/Playing Tests: These assessments are always conducted during regular class time. It is the responsibility of the student to make up any missed tests.

Practice Organizers: Practice organizers start around the third week of school. Each student is required to record the week's practice goals and reflect on practice activities. Organizers are intended to teach students a proper and efficient way to practice.

Uniform

The uniform for all band performances is a white shirt (collar shirts are best) and black from the waist down (including black socks). Skirts are acceptable provided they are not short or tight. Socks/ Shoes should also be black

Eighth grade band members will be issued a black Slauson Music Department shirt that is provided for "away" performances. Shirts should be laundered or dry-cleaned before return.

School Instruments/Equipment

Students using school equipment are responsible for loss or damage, accidental or intentional. Students sharing school instruments are also held to this standard. Be aware that there is no music budget or school insurance to cover student damage.

"Practice Makes Progress"

Excellence is achieved through persistence and hard work. Band students are expected to work well in class, as well as practice their instrument outside of class. Our experience has shown that students who practice regularly are the ones who are successful and happy with their band experience because they feel comfortable with their instrument and the class material. Please encourage your child to practice on a regular basis. Frequency is more important than time spent in an individual session. The Practice Organizer will help students use their time efficiently. Chances to Practice in School --after school, advisory and lunch with permission from staff. **NEED HELP????** Schedule an appointment for us to assist you after school.

Parent FYI

*****PARENTS - You are advised to check your home owners/renters policy for personal instrument coverage outside the home and to keep a record of the instrument information (make, model, serial#). The music department does not receive funding to repair student damages and school insurance does not cover any instrument loss or damage.

Private Lessons

All students will benefit from private lessons (and we urge all students to consider taking lessons sometime during their middle school career). Private lessons are strongly recommended for those needing additional individualized support as well as those seeking additional motivation for advancement. There are a number of good private teachers in the area that we can recommend. Please request by email.

Summer Camp

Consider sending your child to a music camp next summer. Interlochen or Blue Lake Fine Arts Camps are excellent choices. Scholarship opportunities may be available.
